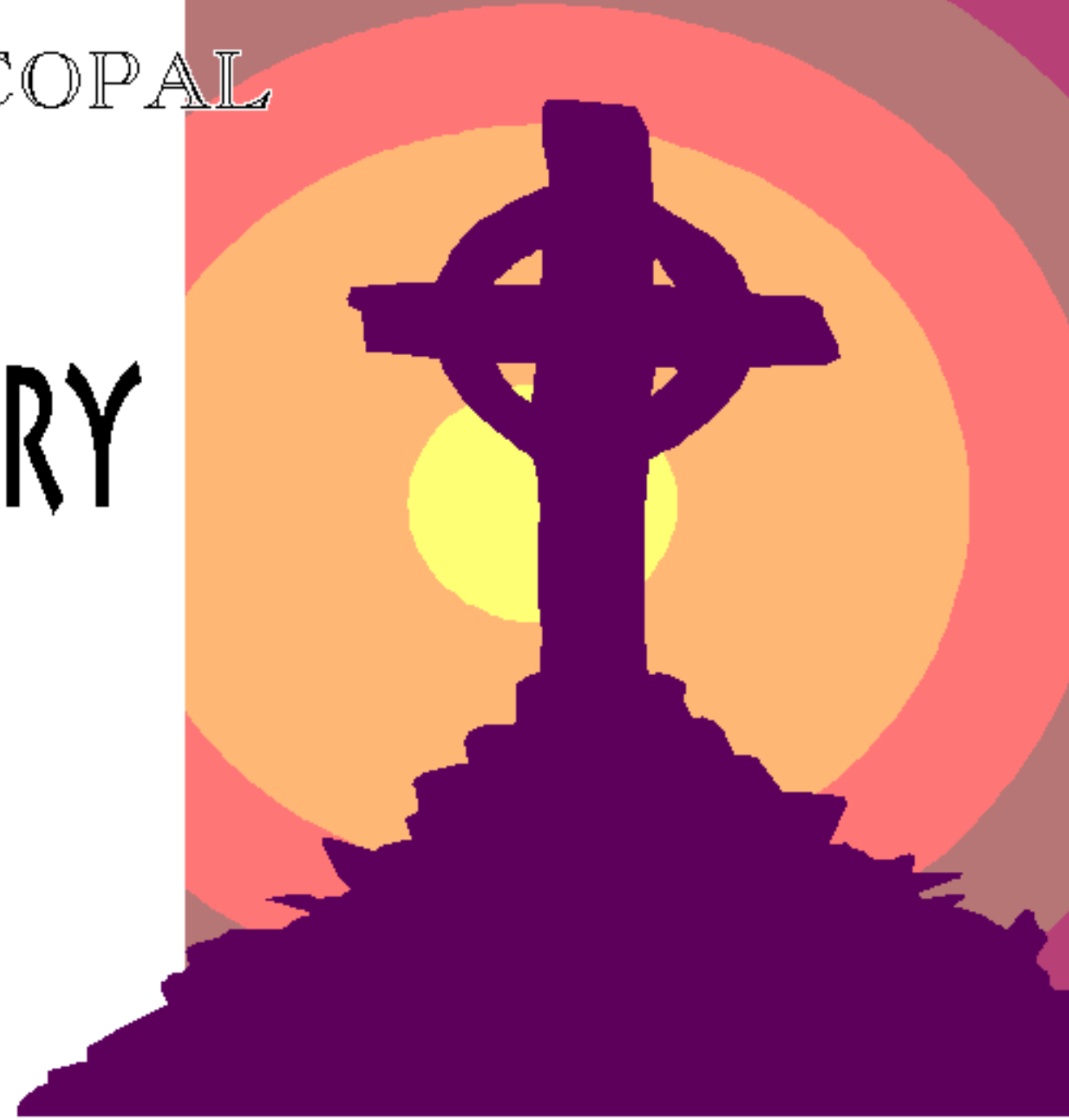

 6. other external signage;
 7. lights by parking lot entrances and walkway by west wall
 8. painting the building

"We have completed the biggest piece of work," according to Fr. Newman. "When we began this project, we knew it would not be completed at the end of this phase." At its June meeting, the Vestry voted to complete the work on "Phase 3" of the project (the essentials of the building's worship space) and to begin part of "Phase 4" (new sanctuary furniture and beginning of Luther Hall work. The building essentials will be completed with the orders that were made on June 18 are constructed and installed. That includes cabinet work in the sanctuary and the completion of the altar platform.

"We have accepted the designs and the bids for the furniture, now we need the gifts and memorials to make it possible." (see page 3 for more information)

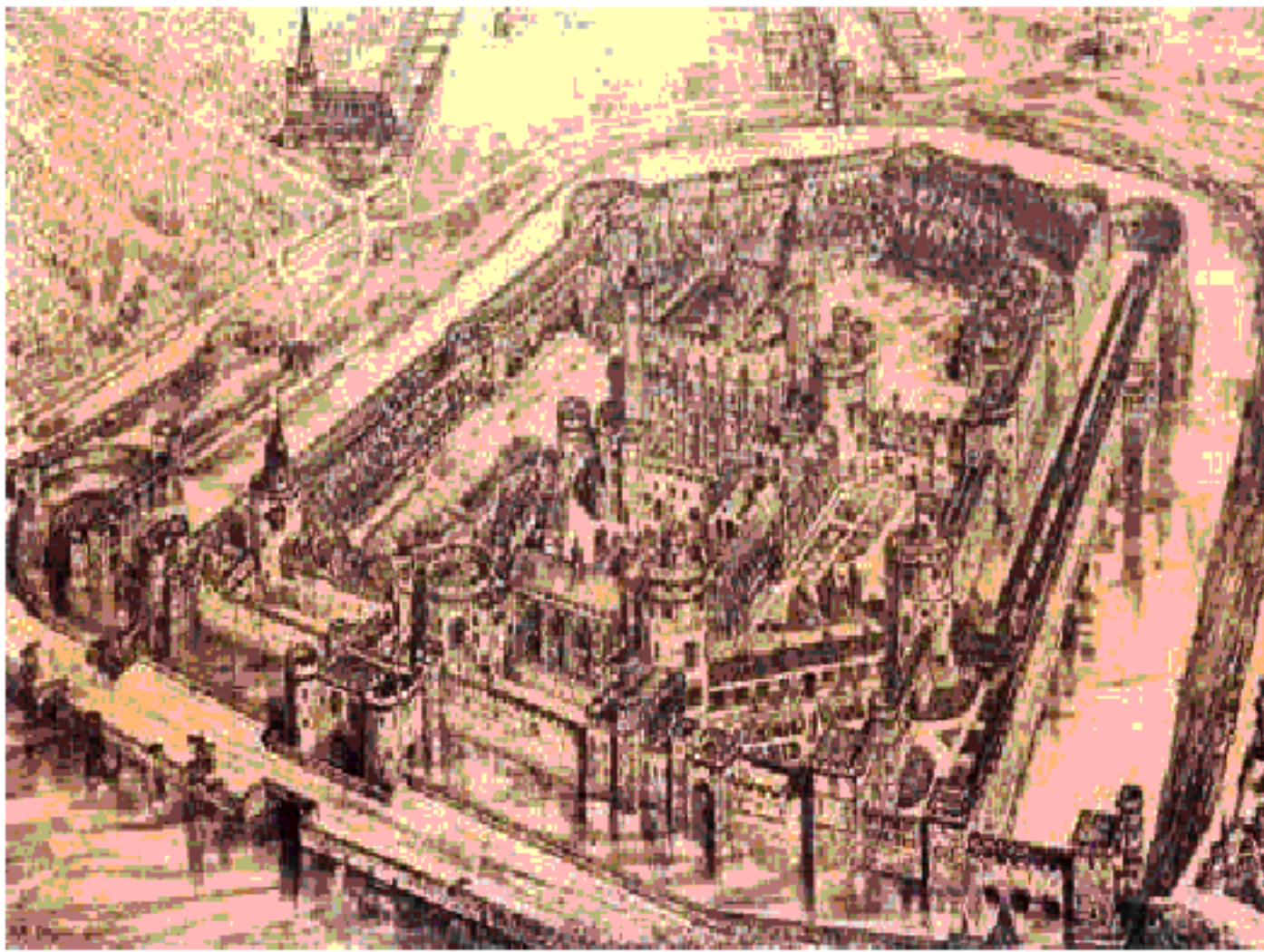

FR. JIM'S JOTTINGS

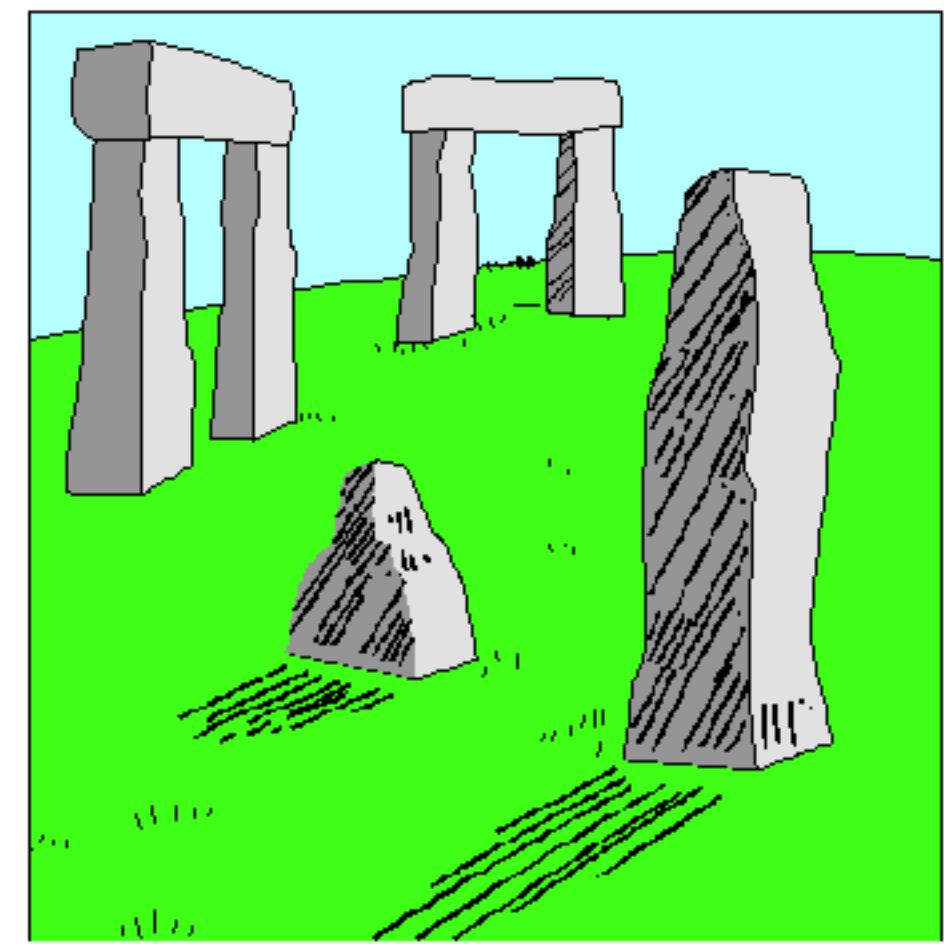
