## LUTHER HALL RENOVATION TO BEGIN

The Vestry has approved the plans for Phase One of Luther Hall Renovation. The work will commence in August and end by Labor Day. The work will include removal of old carpeting in the nursery, Library & main hall as well as the current linoleum in the kitchen. New tiles will be laid in the hall and kitchen, while the library will have carpet squares and the nursery will have an area rug. A set of cabinets will be built on the north wall to provide for additional storage. A chair-rail will be placed on the walls and the windows. On the walls, carpeting will be attached below the rail and continuous display boards will be installed above. In addition, nine doors will have windows cut into them to conform with current insurance expectations. The total cost will be approximately \$35,000.

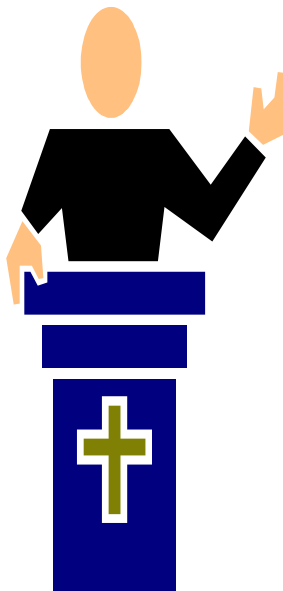

# CANON JIM'S JOTTINGS

Dear Friends in Christ:

Sunday, May 22nd was Fr. Howard Happ's final day of ministry at St. Bede's. He preached a masterful sermon about the Trinity. Howard is, in fact, one of three or four clerics in the Diocese who are probably intellectually up to preaching on the Trinity — seriously.

Fr. Howard is an "associated priest", that is he is not paid to be here. Like Fr. John & Fr. Giles, he chooses to worship here, but is employed elsewhere. Fr. Giles is the Executive Director of the 8th Province of the Episcopal Church (currently on medical leave) and Fr. John is retired. Fr. Happ recently retired as a Professor of the History of Religion at Cal State University, Northridge (CSUN). He is also a former Instructor at "Bloy House" (now ETS Claremont), an Examining



Chaplain, and a member of the Commission on Ministry.

Fr. Happ retired and has now moved to the Canterbury (the Episcopal Home in Palos Verdes) because of the onset of Parkinson's disease. This has been a difficult time for someone who loves to teach, to preach, to entertain, to drive, etc. It is not the retirement in several years in Iowa that he had planned. However, we do what we can and need to do and he had made a number of hard choices in recent months. He is near to both St. Francis' Parish (Palos Verdes) and St. Peter's Parish (San Pedro) and knows both of the rectors. We will publish his address and telephone number in the July Quill

One of Fr. Howard's lesser know hobbies is the creation of telephone answering messages and table graces based on the calendar of greater & lesser saints. I am hopeful that he will work on that once he is settled. I told him that we would help him publish it

For the past four years, I have been in the ordination process to the diaconate. I would like to share with you, my St. Bede's family, thoughts of my continuing journey to the diaconate.

God has called me to a special ministry of service. As a Deacon, in the name of Jesus Christ, I am called to serve all people, particularly the poor, the weak, the sick and the lonely. May I also add, to serve the least, the last, and the lost.

I conduct my ministry in these ways:

A principal part of this formation is to undergo and complete a course of academic studies in preparation for canonical exams and to ordination to the Diaconate.

I will continue my studies at The Episcopal Theological School at Claremont (E.T.S.C.) starting this Fall semester.

I would like to thank you for your prayers and ask you for your continued support as I continue my journey to serve God.

I heard the call of the Lord, and I answered, *"Here am I. Send me!"*
