PENTECOST

Pentecost Sunday is one of the most ancient feasts of the Church, celebrated early enough to be mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles and St. Paul's 1st Letter to the Corinthians. It is the 50th day after Easter (if we count both Easter and Pentecost), and it supplants the Jewish feast of Pentecost, which took place 50 days after the Passover and which celebrated the sealing of the Old Covenant on Mount Sinai.

The Acts of the Apostles (Ch. 2) recounts the story of the original Pentecost as well. Jews from all over were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish feast. On that Sunday, ten days after Jesus' Ascension, the Apostles were gathered in the Upper Room. Suddenly, there was a great sound of wind, the appearance of something like flames over their heads and they spoke in a multitude of languages (tongues).

Christ had promised his Apostles that he would send the Holy Spirit, and, on Pentecost, the Spirit arrived. The Apostles began to preach the Gospel in all of the languages that the Jews who were gathered there spoke, and about 3,000 people were converted and baptized that day.

That is why Pentecost is often called "the birthday of the Church." On this day, with the descent of the Holy Spirit, Christ's mission is completed, and the New Covenant is inaugurated. We celebrate the day with red vestments and the extinguishing of the Paschal Candle after the final service.

Fr. John J. Hancock passed away on Monday, May 19, 2014. Fr. John was an assisting priest at St. Bede's from 1989-2006. Prior to that he served in the Diocese of Los Angeles at the Church of the Reconciliation (1979-1987) and Nativity (1973-75). Before coming to this Diocese, he served congregations in the Diocese of Northwest Texas: Colorado City and Sweetwater; the Diocese of San Joaquin (CA): Porterville, Taft, Susanville, Quincy and Hanford; and the Diocese of Oregon: Tillamook and Medford. He was ordained to the Diaconate (1946) and the Priesthood (1947) by the Rt. Rev. Sumner Walters, Bishop of San Joaquin.

John Hancock was born in Aberdeen, SD on August 4, 1919. Following graduation at Palo Alto (CA) High School, he studied at Menlo Jr. College (1939) and received his BMus. in 1942 from the University of the Pacific. His graduate included: Church Divinity School of the Pacific: cert. 1945/M.Div., 1971; and other study at Pepperdine Univ, 1971; Loyola Univ., 1972; UCLA, 1975. He is predeceased by his former wife Dorothy Hancock and her son David Smith, and is survived by his daughters Dorien McClellan and Rebecca Wright. Fr. Hancock's life will be celebrated at the 10 a.m. service on Sunday, June 22 with his parish family and his daughters.
